Bentz is a graduate of the Vancouver Playhouse Acting School and received her Bachelor of Arts from the University of Alberta. Since then she has worked tirelessly as Co-Founder and Co-Artistic Director of the internationally award winning full figure theatre company for which she has written, performed and produced the troupe's highly acclaimed original works all over the world. full figure theatre received The Award of Excellence in Adelaide, Australia and the Scotsman's Pick of the Day Award for the troupe's production of THE F WORD (OR CAN FEMINISM BE FUNNY?). In addition, full figure's production of way too blonde received the Best O' the Fest award in Melbourne, Australia. Presently, Bentz is working with full figure on their annual Women's Day Festival, busTin' ouT six, which is a four-day festival highlighting original work of Canadian female talent. The festival also features a series of workshops as well as a forum entitled THE BUSINESS OF CREATIVITY.
